FROM THE CHAIR



President Alan Kernich's Annual President's Report given at the COMCC A.G.M. – July 2022

Firstly, I would like to thank our committee for the all the time and energy they have invested into making our club year another successful one. Our membership has declined a little over the past 12 months, perhaps not surprising in view of the stop-start pandemic we have all been experiencing. On the other hand our web and Facebook presence is continuing to grow and improve. The creation of a Facebook groups for the Festival of Motorcycling and a separate Classic Owners MCC dedicated group are recent examples.

Our regular monthly meetings have been able to continue apart from two Covid-19 cancellations in July and January. A range of speakers accepted our invitation to speak to the club. Their presentation topics ranged from historic racing to motorcycle touring in South East Asia and round the world sailing. On nights when no speaker was available, DVD movies were shown during supper.

The standout activity for the year was the 2021 Festival of Motorcycling. Covid-19 restrictions once again resulted in us not being able to stage our planned events at Hart's Mill. However Motorcycle Ride Week attracted increased interest and the Night of Champions event was a runaway sold-out success. The Festival of Motorcycling clubs working together were able to donate \$4225 to their charity partner, SAHMRI PhD Medical Research Student Bursary Fund. Our special thanks go to Lew Hylton for his amazing input into creating and organising this event.

A renewal of Covid restrictions caused the cancellation of the usually very well attended All British Day which was to have been held in February at Echunga. Some fast work by our Festival of Motorcycling participating clubs resulted in a consolation event for British motorcycles at the Balhannah Oval in the Adelaide Hills. This event was a great success. Over 900 spectators through the gate and over 270 bikes on display! \$1500 went to the SAMRI Bursary Fund. The FOM committee is already planning the next British Motorcycle Day for 2023.

Preparations for this year's Festival of Motorcycling in October are well in hand, and we can look forward to an excellent event during October. This year the Hart's Mill events should go ahead as planned. Historic bike display, show and shine competition, and our cavalcade ride.

The club's Annual Dinner is being held on Saturday 20 August. Our club's 60 year celebrations and prize giving for the motorcycle restoration competition will be included. Life Memberships and the Club Member of the year award will also be presented. Members' and partners' meals are heavily subsidised by the club. Tickets are now available on the club web site.

Please be proactive, spread the word and keep our club vibrant, active, and well supported.

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

This edition of the Courier marks my 10th year as Editor of the Classic Courier, taking over from the



late Mike Brown (Whiskers). It was more than a change of Editor as the *Courier* moved online, became a quarterly (previously every two months) and it cost members \$10 to have a printed copy posted to them (previously free). The changes were driven by the then Vice President Bob Chantrell who had established the club's web site and saw the need for the club to move on-line. A move not endorsed by many members at the time. The reasoning for the change is in my 2012 Editor's Comments: 'A majority of the members use e-mail so the club can make large savings on printer's bills and many of the functions of the magazine can be done

better via the club's web site classicownwers.org...

I think many at the time, me included, though the printed version of the *Courier* would disappear as members read their colour copy on-line and saved \$10. (Now \$12, incidentally; most of the blame for the increase can be put on Australia Post- someone has to pay for the Cartier watches). However, print copy subscriptions have been fairly constant over the 10 years at around 70. That said, I think the editor in 10 years' time at the 70th Anniversary of the COMCC will post the latest edition in the 'meta universe', and ride his electric Ducati to a swap meet to find some parts for those old bikes he or she has in the shed.

Congratulations to the Classic Owners MCC on reaching 60 years. Although you are entitled to free public transport, I'm sure most of your travel will be on two wheels.

2022 COMCC Restoration Award

The COMCC Anniversary AGM and General Meeting in July was enlivened with the judging of the 2022 Restoration Award. This award has been revived after being dormant for many years and is open to members who complete a restoration in the current year. Two bikes were entered this year: Barry Young's 1946 Excelsior Moped and Alan Kernich's 1976 Triumph Triple. The entrants gave a brief history of their machines and the bike's restoration. Barry's moped was sold by Adelaide dealer Lenroc and came into his hands from an extended rest period of 50 years in Palmer, It arriving in his shed rusty with a seized motor. Barry rebuilt the two-stroke motor and did a 'bare metal' restoration on the cycle parts, included fabricating metal leg guards. One departure from the original bike was to spray the rims silver. Barry commented the original black rims gave the bike a rather funerial look. Alan's Triumph boasted a most exotic back story. The triple began life as a police bike in the Arabian Gulf and was imported to Perth in 2020. When the bike arrived in Adelaide, it still had the single seat and other police bike specifications. Alan rebuilt much of the motor, although the bottom end was still within specification and new pistons were substituted for the police spec. low compression items. As can be seen from the photo, the bike is now civilian, with restored, rebuilt, or new cycle parts.

The difficult task of deciding the winner was up to the panel of Club Captain Tony Mitchell, Machine Registrar Bob Finnie, and Vice President Bob Cole. Bob declared the Triumph Triple the winner. A cheeky audience member shouted to Alan ' Does it run?'. He replied, 'I rode it here!'- Well done Alan.

The event scheduled for Sunday 5 June did not occur due to nobody except the coordinators and the back-up trailer arriving at Rankine Street Strathalbyn for the start. Inclement weather had been forecast for most of the week; but apart from a few showers, the fire and brimstone predicted by the weather bureau as a certainty did not happen. However it certainly scared off motorcyclists, as we did not see a single motorcyclist on the road to and from Adelaide. The normal crowded curbs at Strath were strangely devoid of two wheelers as was the Meadows Bakery.

A few days prior to the event we received a phone call from a club member suggesting we postpone for a week.

This we could not agree to for several reasons:

- How could we advise participants, as we rarely know who will be riding until they arrive on the day?
- How could we plan another day without causing anguish to those who intended to come and would be inconvenienced and perhaps unable to change their plans?
- We had planned to lunch at Finniss several weeks in advance as is necessary. To organise the same or another venue at such short notice could have been fraught with uncertainty. We had to cancel our booking and hope it has not jeopardised our good will with the venue.

I was a member of the Atujara MCC for over 70years. For many years we conducted the Annual Laurie Boulter Motocross on ANZAC Day April 25, a notoriously wet weather day. It was never cancelled and the riders and spectators still turned up every year, as did the army of officials required to conduct the event.

Warren Duncan, Paul David with the back-up trailer, and I as the tail-end Charlie were obliged to be in attendance in case some intrepid member, unafraid of getting wet, arrived at Rankin Street expecting us to be there. Incidentally, only one person phoned to say he would not be riding due to the expected weather.

Nobody is obliged to ride or participate in any club event, but those who volunteer to do a job are expected to.

The Williamstown Wander 7 August 2022



TECHNICAL TIP



If you have an under slung brake calliper as I have on my Triumph Bonneville and the pad pins screw in, it's a good idea to smear a little grease on the pin threads. The accumulation of road crud and the fact the pads have only

been changed once in 130,000kms led one of pins to freeze. The pins are relatively soft in comparison to the usual Allen bolt, and the flats were easily rounded off when I applied some serious force. A visit from 'Captain Thread' saved the day, and the pins were easy replaced. But a little grease could have made it a 5 minute job for the price of the brake pads. **TJ**



Children's Christmas Party Sunday 27th November 1988






Members and visitors left from the Norwood club rooms on another overcast and chilly morning, just after 9.00am.

CLUB REGISTRATION REGULATIONS

Historic Registration is now 'Club Registration'

Regulations Regarding Financial Membership and Club Registration - Club Registration of a vehicle is conditional on the owner being a financial

Club Registration of a vehicle is conditional on the owner being a mancial member of a registered car or motorcycle club. COMCC requires the vehicle must be inspected by a machine examiner, after which a log book will be issued. Club Registration is not transferable upon the sale of the vehicle.
Vehicles must be over 30 years old (eg a bike manufactured in 1988 is eligible July 2018). Some modifications to historic vehicles are allowed for safety reasons – check with the machine registrar.

- Regardless of your joining date, your membership renewal is due by the 30th June and if it is not paid by this date your vehicle is not registered and cannot be legally ridden on the road.

- It is your responsibility to ensure that your dues are paid by this date and that your Log Book is stamped for the current financial year.

The Club is obliged by law to inform the Motor Registration Department of any owners of Club registered vehicles who are not financial, (no longer members of the Club) and their Club registration is cancelled.

<u>Members whose dues are not paid by the due date will be asked to re-join</u> and pay the \$10 joining fee, unless the Committee considers that there are extenuating circumstances.
