











Annual Dinner





GREEK COLUMN


On a recent trip to Greece. I had a chance to have a look at the local motorcycling scene. Like most big cities, in Athens the scooter is king. Parking or lack of it, plus petrol costing roughly twice the Australian price makes two wheelers a logical choice. And there is plenty of choice from the traditional Vespa, small capacity Japanese/Chinese scooters through to the big 600-800cc step-throughs. But there is no shortage of big bikes. Again, all makes are represented, Triumph Street Triples seem to be a favourite along with BMW Adventure bikes. The latter were in great numbers on the open road. I thought the motorway system was excellent and the secondary roads scenic and well maintained. A combination of the roads and warm weather bring groups of riders from many Europe countries. Big BMW Adventure bikes, were a common sight on the open road. I never did figure out the helmet laws; officially, a helmet is compulsory but in practice optional. I didn't manage to get to a motorcycle museum; but if you have an interest in cars and an hour to fill in Athens, the Hellenic Motor Museum has a good collection of classic and rare sports cars. It's about 10 minutes' walk from the Archaeological Museum. TJ

CLUB REGISTRATION REGULATIONS

Historic Registration is now 'Club Registration'
Regulations Regarding Financial Membership and Club Registration

- Club Registration of a vehicle is conditional on the owner being a financial member of a registered car or motorcycle club. Club Registration is not transferable upon the sale of the vehicle.
- Vehicles must be over 25years old (eg a bike manufactured in 1998 is eligible July 2023). Some modifications to historic vehicles are allowed for safety reasons check with the machine registrar.
- Regardless of your joining date, your membership renewal is due by the 30th June and if it is not paid by this date your vehicle is not registered and cannot be legally ridden on the road.
- It is your responsibility to ensure that your dues are paid by this date and that your Log Book correctly filled in and is stamped for the current financial year.

The Club is obliged by law to inform the Motor Registration Department of any owners of Club registered vehicles who are not financial, (no longer members of the Club) and their Club registration is cancelled.

Members whose dues are not paid by the due date will be asked to re-join and pay the \$10 joining fee, unless the Committee considers that there are extenuating circumstances.

Lost Log Book Replacement

If a Log Book is lost or destroyed, a replacement can be issued by your authorising club only upon proof of the balance of 90 day's use in any year. It is suggested that you keep a separate record of events attended and other usage.
